	6	To analyze how Islamic philosophy takes shape; and formation of its logical, physical, metaphysical and political dimensions.;
	7	To interpret the interaction between theology and philosophy, and systematical rejection of philosophy.;
	8	To evaluate philosophical activities in the Western Muslim World and prominent thinkers.;
	9	To compare the approaches of Maghrib and Andalus philosophers to relationship between philosophy and religion.;
